

Interviewer: All right, David, tell me a little bit about your hand and what was going on? And what you did about it? How long has it been bothering you for?

And I slept with that and I cut my hand here. And I was told not to go bowling for a while, but I went bowling that night. But they had my hand all in a big fist. And taped up, but I was able to bowl.

And it just ... It has hurt ever since. And doesn't ... It's not hurting at all now. And it usually, it would hurt a lot when I was using the cane for walking. And it was this area here. But it's all gone now.

Interviewer: So ever since your PRP injection with Suzy?

David: Yeah, yeah.

Interviewer: That's awesome. So when did you first notice that it was working?

David: The PRT?

Interviewer: Yeah.

David: The next morning.

Interviewer: That's awesome. So the next morning you knew it wasn't hurting anymore?

David: The next morning it wasn't hurting.

Interviewer: Wow, so 50 years of pain and then all of a sudden, the next morning it's gone, that's awesome.

David: Yeah.

Interviewer: What advice would you give to somebody else who's having some chronic pain like that?

David: Well, I would advise them to get some plasma shot in there. That's what stopped my hurting was the plasma.

Interviewer: Right. The platelet rich plasma. The PRP. That's great.

David: She stuck it, needle in my hand right in here.

Interviewer: Right about there?

David: And that might be where.

Interviewer: Well, that's awesome.

David: Yeah.

Interviewer: I'm really happy for you, David.

David: Oh, I am too.

Interviewer: And we're just getting started on your treatment because that wasn't even your primary concern that you were here for, right? You came in for your knee?

David: No, I came here for my knee. But I was wearing a wrist brace and she said that she would want to do the wrist and the knee.

Interviewer: That's awesome. Well, I'm going to go ... I'll see if she's here and we'll get you started on your-

David: Yeah, I'm supposed to have another shot in my knee today.

Interviewer: Yeah, we'll get your knee treatment going. I'm just glad you're doing well. And I appreciate you taking the time to tell your story. All right.
